

**Dr. Scott W. Lackey
Deputy Director

Dr. Scott W. Lackey is Deputy Director, Center for Army Lessons Learned, United States Army Combined Arms Center, Ft. Leavenworth, Kansas.

Dr. Lackey entered into Federal Service with the United States Army in January 1992 as an Assistant Combined Arms Center historian, after having completed bachelors, masters and doctor of philosophy degrees at Ohio Wesleyan University and the University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill in the fields of modern European history and German studies. During the course of his graduate work, Dr. Lackey studied as a Fulbright Scholar at the Ludwig-Maximilians-Universitaet in Munich, Germany, served as an intern in the parliamentary research service of the West German Parliament (Bundestag) and conducted doctoral research as a Truman Scholar in the Vienna military (Kriegsarchiv) and Habsburg state archives (Haus-, Hof- und Staatsarchiv).

In 1994, he became Chief of the Warrior Information Network of the Army Knowledge Network (AKN) Directorate, charged with the archiving and dissemination of the Army's Combat Training Center (CTC) experience. In 1997, he became Chief, Research Division of the Center for Army Lessons Learned (CALL), following the merging of the AKN Directorate with CALL in March 1996. In 2005, Dr. Lackey became Deputy Director, CALL.

Dr. Lackey is the author of numerous articles, including "Putting Knowledge Reachback into Practice," March-April 2003, *Military Review*, and "Spreading the Gospel of Lessons Learned," *Connections*, No. 2, June 2003, as well as the book *The Rebirth of the Habsburg Army: Friedrich Beck and the Rise of the General Staff*, Greenwood Press, 1995.
