



### **Bradley J. Mason (Brad)**

- **Chief, United States Forces Command (FORSCOM), G-3/5/7, Strategic Initiatives Division, and Director, FORSCOM Knowledge Office**

Brad Mason is a retired Army colonel with over 26 years of experience in multi-faceted operations in Army, joint, and combined environments. A graduate of the University of Florida, he was commissioned into the Field Artillery in 1979. He served in Army Aviation including command of a UH-60 company during Operation JUST CAUSE in Panama, and of both a forward deployed Theater Aviation Battalion in Honduras, and of the Army's Flight School Training Battalion at Fort Rucker, Alabama. He performed numerous staff assignments at the battalion, division, and Combatant Command levels; and served four years with NATO as the Chief of the Deployable Headquarters Task Force, and as Chief of the NATO Response Force Implementation Team. His last assignment in uniform was as the State Inspector General for the Georgia Army and Air National Guard.

Since his military retirement, he has served as a Department of the Army Civilian within the United States Forces Command (FORSCOM) G-3/5/7, Strategic Initiatives Division (SID). SID has the mission as the staff lead for the synchronization and integration of developmental and transformational Army and FORSCOM initiatives; and as the FORSCOM lead and staff nexus for Army Campaign Plan integration and Knowledge Management (KM). Over the last year, SID assumed responsibility as the locus for leading FORSCOM's development of the Readiness Core Enterprise in support of the CSA's Army Enterprise initiative. Leading FORSCOM's KM efforts since 2007, Mr. Mason was responsible for spearheading the development of the Army's Warfighters' Forum (WfF) program, the inclusion of KM positions in ASCC, Corps, and Division staff structures, and instituting FORSCOM's KM organization and strategy.

Mr. Mason is a graduate of the Air War College, the U.S. Army School of Advanced Military Studies (SAMS), the Army Command and General Staff College, the Infantry Officer Advanced Course and the Field Artillery Officer Basic Course.
