AOKM Qualification Course

The Army Operational Knowledge Management Qualification Course (AOKMQC) provides the Army with school-trained and qualified personnel to staff KM Sections at all levels of command. Graduates of the 3-week course are awarded the Additional Skill Identifier (ASI) 1E, Knowledge Management Professional. This ASI will help the Army identify and track officers, warrant officers and enlisted personnel who are AOKMQC graduates and who are best qualified for assignment to KM Sections.



The course focuses on knowledge management's three pillars - people, process, and technology - and their application within Army operational units. Specific topics include:



The AOKM Proponent completed a pilot for the AOKMQC Course and awarded the ASI 1E to 13 students on 6 May 2011. The course consisted of students from unit Knowledge Management Sections from theater Army headquarters (USARAF) down to combat and functional brigades (130th Eng Bde). The student body spanned across components (Active, National Guard, Reserve) and included both military personnel (SFC-LTC) and Department of the Army civilians.

A second pilot course will be conducted from 18 July through 5 August 2011 at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas.
