## **Gary G. Bishop**

### **AMC-G3/5 Concept Development- Future Capability**

Mr. Gary Bishop serves as a Logistics Management Supervisor in AMC G3/5 Concept Development and Future Capabilities Division. His primary areas of responsibility include supervising the development of AMC strategies and concept plans which integrate Department of Defense wide logistics operations such as the Army Sustainment Command and Brigade Logistics Support Teams, work loading the Army RESET process, and the AMC plan to support the Army Warfighters' Forum Network. Additionally, Mr. Bishop supervises AMC G3/5 Future Combat System staffing actions, the development of support plans for improved Contingency Contracting Support, the integration of the Surface Deployment and Distribution Command into the Army Materiel Command as well as Joint Logistics staffing actions.

Mr. Bishop, a native of Sabina, Ohio, was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in the United States Army in 1972 following graduation from Bowling Green State University, Bowling Green Ohio. In 1995 he earned a Master's Degree in Public Administration from Shippensburg State University. His military education includes the Transportation Officer Basic Course, Petroleum Officer Advanced Course, Quartermaster Officer Advanced Course, Logistics Executive Development Course, Command and General Staff College, and the Army War College.

Mr. Bishop served in the U.S. Army for over 30 years and completed service in the grade of Colonel. His last military assignment was as the Executive Officer to the Deputy Commanding General, Army Materiel Command. Prior to assuming his duties in the AMC G3 Future Operations, Mr. Bishop was assigned to AMC as the Chief of Staff, Tank-Automotive and Armaments Command in Warren, Michigan.

Mr. Bishop also served as Commander, 10<sup>th</sup> Area Support Group, Okinawa, Japan; G 4 1<sup>st</sup> Cavalry Division, Ft. Hood, Texas; Commander, 115th Forward Support Battalion, 1<sup>st</sup> Cavalry Division, Ft. Hood, Texas; Executive Officer, 101<sup>st</sup> Corps Support Group, 1<sup>st</sup> COSCOM, Ft. Campbell, Kentucky and Southwest Asia during Desert Storm; Division Materiel Management Center Executive Officer and 1<sup>st</sup> FASCO, 101<sup>st</sup> Airborne Division, Air Assault, Ft. Campbell, Kentucky.

Additional duty assignments included Chief of Petroleum, 21<sup>st</sup> SUPCOM, Kaiserslautern, Germany; Logistics Advisor, Readiness Group, Ft. Jackson, SC.; Company Commander and Technical Supply Officer, 2d SUPCOM, Wurtzberg, Germany; Platoon Leader, 530<sup>th</sup> Supply and Service Battalion and Movements Control Officer, 330<sup>th</sup> Transportation Battalion, 1<sup>st</sup> COSCOM, Ft.
