

Major Anita Rynne, Australian Army

Major Anita Rynne joined the Australian Army Reserve in 1990 and was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in 1992 after attending the Army Reserve 01/92 Full Time Commissioning Course. Concurrent to her Reserve service, Major Rynne completed a Bachelor of Education (Secondary Studies) and began her teaching at Townsville State High School, where she gained registration as a qualified Social Sciences teacher in 2003.



In January 1994, Major Rynne was appointed as an Education Officer to the Australian Regular Army, and held various postings including Modern History Coordinator; Instructor / Coordinator Subject 3 (Literacy and Numeracy) suite of courses; Training Developer; Instructional Designer (Multimedia); and Second-in-Command of an Education Wing.

In 2002, Major Rynne graduated from Florida State University in Tallahassee, Florida, USA with a Master of Science (Instructional Systems). This qualification linked to her employment as the Staff Officer Grade Two Training Systems, at Headquarters Training Command – Army, and as Project Manager for the Future of Doctrine Proof of Concept trial at Land Warfare Development Centre (LWDC). MAJ Rynne has been employed by LWDC from the USA, where she is currently developing a Knowledge Management Strategy for Army.
