COL Greg Johnson is the Director of the Heavy Brigade Combat Team Warfighters' Forum at Fort Hood, Texas.

Greg graduated from Texas A&M University with a Bachelor's in Animal Science and was commissioned in 1982 as an Armor officer. He served as a Cavalry platoon leader, Cavalry troop commander, and an Armor battalion commander in the 49th Armored Division. He also served as Deputy Professor of Military Science at Texas A&M University, and a Mobilization Plans Officer at Texas State Area Command. After completing his Masters in Strategic Studies in 2004, Greg served as the J3 for JFHQ-Texas, and later as the Chief of Staff, Texas Military Forces.

In 2006, he was assigned as the G3 for III Corps (Rear) where he led operations for deploying units at Fort Hood. During that time, he was lead in the development of Fort Hood's IED Defeat capabilities training program and the initial work on the Heavy BCT Warfighters' Forum. In October 2007, Greg assumed duties as the III Corps Rear Deputy Commander, assisting the Fort Hood Senior Commander with the day-to-day leadership of Corps elements at home station. In May 2008, he assumed duties as the Director of the HBCT Warfighters' Forum, a Community of Purpose connecting members of the Army's Heavy Forces with elements of the Army's Generating Force to enhance training, leader development and organization of the HBCT.

He is a graduate of the Army War College, Command and General Staff College, and the Armor Officer Advanced Course.
