Brad Mason is a retired Army officer with over 26 years of experience in multi-faceted operations in Army, joint, and combined environments. He performed numerous staff assignments at the battalion, division, and Combatant Command level; and served four years with NATO as the Chief of the Deployable Headquarters Task Force and of the NATO Response Force Implementation Team.

Since his retirement, he has served as an Army Civilian within the FORSCOM G-3/5/7, Advanced Concepts Division. In this capacity, he was the co-lead for the development of the Army Force Generation (ARFORGEN) Implementation Plan and the FORSCOM lead for numerous modular Division and Corps headquarters redesign initiatives. He is currently the FORSCOM lead for the Development of the Warfighters' Forum (WfF) Initiative and chairs the Army's WfF Working Group. The WfF is a web-based knowledge network established to enhance training, readiness, leader development, and to promote collaboration and information sharing across the total Army.

He is a graduate of the Air War College, the U.S. Army School of Advanced Military Studies, the Army Command and General Staff College and the Infantry Officer Advanced Course.
