MR. MICHAEL McCOY



Mr. Michael McCoy is a Senior Military Analyst in the Joint Operations Integration Branch at the Center for Army Lessons Learned at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas. As a Military Analyst he provides reviews and processes information and observations received from military operations and exercises as well as joint, interagency, intergovernmental and multinational organizations. He identifies lessons learned and trends in proficiency and force readiness. Furthermore, Mr. McCoy recommends tactics, techniques and procedures to the United States Army, joint, coalition and interagency partners. He is the primary analyst on civil support, reconstruction and development, and homeland security as it pertains to interagency involvement with United States Army operations. Mr. McCoy possesses a Bachelor of Science in Mathematics from the United States Air Force Academy and a Master of Science in Systems Management from the University of Southern California. He is also a graduate of the Air Command and Staff College, National Security Management (National Defense University), and Air War College.

Mr. McCoy is a former United States Air Force officer retiring in the rank of Colonel in 2004. He is a command pilot with more than 3,500 flying hours in transport and tanker aircraft. Mr. McCoy's command assignments include a detachment at Diego Garcia in the Indian Ocean and an Air Base Group in Bosnia during JOINT GUARD. He also served as the Defense and Air Attaché to Ukraine. His staff tours include working support airlift operations and inspection analysis at Headquarters Military Airlift Command, working with Army and Joint doctrine at the United States Army's Combined Arms Center, managing continuing education programs for the Air Force at Headquarters Air University, and as Chief of Safety at Fifteenth Air Force.
