

- A group-editable Web site where peer reviews keep content current
- A living, powerful knowledge bank where members of the community can instantly contribute their knowledge and expertise
- Tool for both Knowledge Management and Collaboration

Wikis Defined - Why Wiki?

- Quick & easy collaboration
- Platform for learning
- Connects others working similar projects
- Captures organizational expertise, processes, knowledge
- Decreases duplicative, redundant efforts across the organization
- Connects the knowledge with the expert & helps others to find the experts
- Fosters strong sense of community
- Communicates to global workforce while reducing email


Wikis Defined - When to Wiki?

- Reduce meeting time by collaborating on a topic beforehand







- 10/2/2008:** The Vice Presidential Debate will be held Thursday, October 2 at Washington University in St. Louis, Missouri.
- 9/27/2008:** Pirates who on 25 September seized a Belizean-flagged ship, the Faina, off the coast of Somalia have reportedly demanded a ransom of \$35m (£19m) to release the vessel, and its crew. On Friday, the Ukrainian Defense Minister confirmed 33 T-72 tanks and "a substantial quantity of ammunition" were aboard the Faina which was destined to Kenya. For its part, Russia has dispatched a warship, the Neustrashimy, and Russia reportedly will continue to send ships to areas where maritime piracy is a risk to defend the lives of Russian citizens and keep sea lanes safe. There are at least 17 Ukrainians and 3 Russians on board.
- 9/21/2008:** Russian Navy Northern Fleet ships departed Severomorsk for an extended deployment that will include joint training with the Venezuelan Navy in late-November.
- 9/20/2008:** A suicide truck bomb blew up at the front of the Marriott Hotel in Islamabad, Pakistan.
- 9/18/2008:** Media outlets report VP-candidate Sarah Palin's email was hacked by [Anonymous](#), a group linked to the 4chan imageboard.
- 9/17/2008:** US Embassy in Sana'a, Yemen attacked by a car bomb, RPG, and gunfire.
- 9/13/2008:** Hurricane Ike came ashore at 2:10a.m. with Category 2 winds at 110mph after lashing states along the Gulf Coast with high waves and increasing storm surge.
