Colonel Dave Liddell graduated from Northern Michigan University in 1987 as a Distinguished Military Graduate and was commissioned a Second Lieutenant in the Field Artillery. Following graduation from the Field Artillery Officer Basic Course, Colonel Liddell was assigned to the 210th Field Artillery Brigade at Herzo Base, in the Federal Republic of Germany where he served as Battery Fire Direction Officer, Platoon Leader, and Battalion Adjutant. After completing the Field Artillery Officer Advanced Course in 1990, Colonel Liddell was assigned to the 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault) at Fort Campbell, Kentucky where he served in 1st Battalion, 320th Field Artillery as Brigade Targeting Officer, Battalion Fire Support Officer, and Battery Commander.



From 1995 to 1998, Colonel Liddell was assigned to the Pentagon where he served as an Executive Support Officer to the Secretary of Defense. Upon graduating from the Army Command and General Staff College at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, Colonel Liddell was assigned to the 10th Mountain Division (Light Infantry) at Fort Drum, New York. From 1999 to 2003, he served as Assistant Fire Support Coordinator, Brigade Fire Support Officer, Battalion Executive Officer, and Executive Officer in the 10th Division Artillery. As Assistant Fire Support Coordinator, Colonel Liddell deployed in support of Operation Joint Forge to Bosnia-Herzegovina as an Information Operations Coordinator where he synchronized and assessed information operations among five multi-national brigades. Additionally, as a Battalion Executive Officer he deployed in support of Operation Joint Guardian where he led security force operations at Camp Able Sentry in the Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia.

From 2003 to 2005, Colonel Liddell commanded 6th Battalion, 32d Field Artillery (MLRS) at Fort Sill, Oklahoma. In 2005, he returned to Fort Drum where he served as the division's Fire Support Coordinator and Chief of the Joint Fires Element in support of Operation Enduring Freedom. Upon graduating from the U.S. Army War College in 2008, Colonel Liddell was assigned to U.S. Joint Forces Command in Joint Concept Development and Experimentation, where he served as the Concepts Group Deputy and the directorate's Chief of Staff. Colonel Liddell's most recent assignment was at Headquarters, U.S. Army Training and Doctrine Command, Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff, G-3/5/7, as the Director, Training Integration Directorate.

Colonel Liddell's civilian education includes a Master of Science in Administration from Central Michigan University and a Master of Strategic Studies from the U.S. Army War College.
