

**Organizational History of
The Alphabetical Corps Detachments
of the German Army
1942-1945**

Note: These "Korps Abteilung" (Corps Detachments) were formed from the remains of divisions that were severely savaged in combat and were no longer viable divisional organizations. By this process the Germans reorganized the infantry survivors into Regimental Groups, which had the strengths approximately equal to battalions, and then organized the Regimental Groups into Divisional Groups, which were the equivalent of regiments. The remains of the various support units were similarly merged to reform operational units and attached to the divisional groups until a new formation, the equivalent of a division, was formed. These corps detachments met two principal fates: 1.) they were converted into a true division and generally given the name of one of the original divisions used to form it, or 2.) they were broken up and the parent divisions of their constituent parts were reorganized.

: Formed on 11/2/43 by Army Group South from the remains of the 161st, 293rd and 355th Infantry Divisions with the staff of the 161st Infantry Division. The detachment had:

In fact, the infantry of the 332nd Infantry Division was not incorporated into the structure. After the breakout of the Korssun pocket the orders of 2 and 10 March 1944 ordered corps detachment broken up and used to rebuild the 57th and 88th Infantry Divisions. The 88th Infantry Division received the 110th Grenadier Regiment, which was formed from the 112nd Divisional Group. The 57th Infantry Division received the 1/3/86th Artillery Regiment as the 1/,3/157th Artillery Regiment and the 3rd Company/112th Pioneer Battalion. The staff and signals battalion were used to build the Cavalry Corps Command.

: Little is known about this formation. It was organized in late 1943 with the 183rd, 217th, and 339th Division Groups. It was later converted into a newly reorganized 183rd Infantry Division, which was then destroyed in the northern Ukraine. The detachment was organized as follows:
