Mr. LaMoe is the Chief of Staff for the Combined Arms Center Leader Development and Education and the Command and General Staff College at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas. He is the principle advisor to the Deputy Commanding General for planning, resourcing, and daily operations at the Command and General Staff College, in addition to general operational guidance and tracking across the enterprise that includes the: Center for Army Leadership, Center for the Army Professional Ethic, Combat Studies Institute, Military Review, Defense Language Institute, Warrant Officer Career Center, and the Western Hemisphere Institute for Security Cooperation.



Mr. LaMoe is from Littleton, Colorado and a Distinguished Military Graduate from Colorado State University. A retired Colonel, he served on active duty from 1979 to 2005 in a wide variety of leadership assignments as a combat engineer. He commanded the 168th Combat Engineer Battalion, was the senior combat engineer trainer at the National Training Center, and served as Commandant of the National Geospatial-Intelligence School for the National Geospatial-Intelligence Agency.
