


International Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony

The International Hall of Fame

The International Hall of Fame was established in 1973 jointly between USACGSC, The Greater Kansas City Chapter of the Military Order of the World Wars, and the CGSC Alumni Association (now CGSC Foundation). Induction consideration is extended to resident International Military Student graduates of CGSC who, through military merit, attain one of the highest positions of military importance in their country's armed forces. Fifteen IHOF inductees have also gone on to become the chief executive of their country. Honorees are inducted according to precedence established by the year of their graduation.

Inductees are presented a CGSC certificate of honor by the Military Order of the World Wars (MOWW) and a Life Constituent Certificate and eagle statuette from the CGSC Foundation. Their framed portrait is displayed, alongside earlier inductees, in the International Hall of Fame Gallery located on the 3rd floor of the Lewis and Clark Center, Command and General Staff College in Fort Leavenworth, Kansas.



International Leader Development

International Military Student participation in cooperative military studies in the United States originated at Fort Leavenworth with the arrival of Swiss Lieutenant Henri Le Comte in 1894. Since then, International Military Students have become an integral part of the "Fort Leavenworth Experience" with more than 7,000 international officers studying alongside their US Army, Sister Service, and US Interagency counterparts. These talented military officers and their families (representing 153 countries to date) contribute to a rich professional and cultural exchange environment unmatched anywhere in the world.

The post graduate accomplishments of CGSC International Military Students are exceptional. The US Army Command and General Staff College International Hall of Fame (IHOF) displays the portraits of 230 International Hall of Fame inductees. Each of these officers distinguished himself, having attained through merit appointment, the position of Chief of Army or higher in his home country. These portraits stand in witness to centuries of combined uniformed sacrifice and service - undertaken in every corner of the globe - in support of international peace and security.

The Lewis and Clark Center

The Lewis and Clark Center opened August 2007 and was named in honor of Meriwether Clark and William Lewis as a tribute to the 125th anniversary of their legendary expedition that actually crossed near the building site. In addition to being the premiere education facility in the Department of Defense it is also a living museum of gifts and artwork that detail the history of famous Soldiers, international officers, and educators that contributed to the reputation of the college. The hallways are adorned with artwork and stained glass gifts from previous classes, International Students and Distinguished Visitors. In the Atrium is the Fort Leavenworth Hall of Fame with inductees from Henry Leavenworth to General Colin Powell and Medal of Honor recipient Colonel (Ret) Roger Donlon.

The Lewis and Clark Center brings professional military education from the industrial age to the information age with 96 digital classrooms that allow students to conduct real-time research and observe multi-media events by video teleconference anywhere in the world. The facility can accommodate all of the students needs. There are two auditoriums, a food court, barber shop, bookstore, and the CGSC Foundation.


Commanding General of the Combined Arms Center & Commandant of U.S. Army Command & General Staff College.

Deputy Commanding General for Combined Arms, US Army Training and Doctrine Command Director, Joint Center for International Security Force Assistance.

Lieutenant General Caldwell currently serves as the commander of the Combined Arms Center at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, the command that oversees the Command and General Staff College and 17 other schools, centers, and training programs located

throughout the United States. The Combined Arms Center is also responsible for: development of the Army's doctrinal manuals, training of the Army's commissioned and noncommissioned officers, oversight of major collective training exercises, integration of battle command systems and concepts, and supervision of the Army's Center for the collection and dissemination of lessons learned. His prior deployments and assignments include serving as Deputy Chief of Staff for Strategic Effects and spokesperson for the Multi-National Force – Iraq during OPERATION IRAQI FREEDOM, Commanding General of the 82nd Airborne Division; Senior Military Assistant to the Deputy Secretary of Defense; Deputy Director for Operations for the United States Pacific Command; Assistant Division Commander, 25th Infantry Division; Executive Assistant to the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff; Commander, 1st Brigade, 10th Mountain Division; a White House Fellow, The White House; Politico-Military Officer in Haiti during OPERATION RESTORE/UPHOLD DEMOCRACY; Brigade Operations Officer, 3rd Brigade, 82nd Airborne Division during OPERATIONS DESERT SHIELD and DESERT STORM; and Chief of Plans for the 82nd Airborne Division during OPERATION JUST CAUSE in Panama.

Lieutenant General Caldwell's decorations include the Distinguished Service Medal, the Defense Superior Service Medal (with two Oak Leaf Clusters), the Legion of Merit (with two Oak Leaf Clusters), the Bronze Star (with one Oak Leaf Cluster), Humanitarian Service Medal (with 3 Oak Leaf Clusters), Military Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal, Presidential Service Identification Badge, Office of the Secretary of Defense Identification Badge, Joint Chiefs of Staff Identification Badge, the Louisiana Cross of Merit, and the 2008 Honorary ROCK of the year. Lieutenant General Caldwell graduated from the United States Military Academy at West Point in 1976. He earned Masters Degrees from the United States Naval Postgraduate School and from the School for Advanced Military Studies at the United States Army Command and General Staff College. Lieutenant General Caldwell also attended the John F. Kennedy, School of Government, Harvard University as a Senior Service College Fellow.

General Ashfaq Farvez Kayani was commissioned in an Infantry Battalion on 29 Aug 1971, graduated from Command & Staff College in 1985 and did war course from National Defence University in 1993. The General Officer has done many foreign courses to include Infantry Officers Advance Course from Fort Benning (USA); Command and General Staff Course from Fort Leavenworth (USA); Security Studies Course from Asia Pacific Centre (USA). He was promoted Brigadier in 1994, Major General in 1999, Lieutenant General in 2003 and General in 2007.



His command assignments include command of an Infantry Battalion, an Infantry Brigade in the desert, an Infantry Division in Kashmir and a Corps. He has been instructor and Directing Staff at School of Infantry & Tactics, Command & Staff College and National Defence University. His key Operational Staff assignments include Brigade Major of an Infantry Brigade, Deputy Military Secretary to the Prime Minister, General Staff Officer Grade-1 in Military Operations Directorate and Chief of Staff in a Corps. He has also served as Director General Military Operations, Director General Inter Services Intelligence, Vice Chief of Army Staff and presently the General Officer is Chief of Army Staff.

A keen golfer, the General is fond of music and reading. Married to Begum Zahida Kayani, the General is blessed with a son and a daughter who are studying in College and School respectively.
