TABLE OF ORGANIZATION FOR A BASE SECTION

1. Introduction.

a. The purpose of this study is to present a recommended table of organization for a Base Section in a Theater of Operations, based upon the experience gained in the European Theater. In the preparation of this study, use has been made of the available factual data, documents and experience, both of individual officers and of Communications Zone Sections. An effort has been made to devise a flexible organization capable of performing its assigned mission in any Theater of Operations, and having the following principal characteristics:

- (1) A headquarters organization for the exercise of purely staff functions.
- (2) A basic organization essential to any base section in any Theater of Operations.
- (3) Ability of the organization to expand or decrease in size and strength, and to assume new responsibilities or functions according to requirements of local conditions.
- (4) Flexibility for operation in a compact geographical area and for augmentation if the area expands, necessitating the establishment of town or area commands.
- (5) Provision of sufficient basic troops necessary to its own existence and housekeeping, such as a service company or headquarters company.
- (6) Provision of sufficient administrative units, such as groups and depots, to provide the overhead operating personnel for the section.

b. The organization of a base section as recommended herein is therefore based upon the recommendations of certain key officers in the European Theater of Operations, and upon evaluations of various base section organizations which existed in the European Theater. It is, therefore, an organization capable of efficient, effective operation in a theater similar to the European Theater. No consideration has been given to the modifications which may be necessary when operating under conditions, other than those which existed in the European Theater except that the organization is sufficiently flexible to readjust itself to new conditions by the addition of cellular units as required. Finally, the proposed organization represents the minimum required for either a base or intermediate section, and must be augmented by administrative troops for each district headquarters when operating over an extensive area, and for each major port or beach area.

c. A definite table of organization for a base or intermediate section will materially expedite the development of a given area for the support of the field forces, as experience indicated that:

- (1) It would facilitate the development of an administrative organization by providing a definite allotment of personnel and,
- (2) The base section headquarters will be able more effectively to perform its mission immediately upon its assumption of command, as the necessary personnel will have been available to formulate policies prior to the organizations becoming operational.

2. Organization.

a. The proposed organization of the base section (Appendices 3 - 33) represents the minimum personnel requirements for a base section operating under conditions similar to those met in the European Theater, and is based upon the normal functioning of the headquarters with six executive, thirteen administrative, and seven technical sections.

b. Within the base section headquarters the normal command relationship exists (appendix 3). The staff sections are, in general, responsible for their normal functions, and have been reduced in size to an extent consistent with their responsibilities. The proposed table of organization manning chart for the headquarters, base section, is shown in appendix 4. Each staff section has been carefully considered so that allocated grades and ratings will enable the section effectively to perform its responsibilities, while achieving an economical utilization of manpower. The military occupation specialty numbers as shown on the organizational charts for the individual sections will, it is believed, provide well balanced sections.

c. A normal table of organization unit has not been recommended for the headquarters company, as experience indicates that a more economical utilization of manpower, and a more effective organization for maintenance of the headquarters is possible by the utilization of cells from the service organizations of the technical services (Cell A of Appendix 5). The utilization of a Quartermaster company headquarters (Cell AC of T/O & E 10-500) facilitates the formation of all the individual cells into a self-sustaining organization which, when augmented by a Quartermaster service company (white), is capable of providing the necessary maintenance and overhead to create a self-supporting headquarters, except for transportation facilities which will be provided by the basic attached troops (Cell B, Appendix 5).

d. The administrative responsibilities of the headquarters commandant are simplified by providing a Quartermaster battalion headquarters (Cell AD), which is utilized to consolidate the headquarters company, the Quartermaster car companies, and the headquarters detachment into one organization.

e. The basic troops essential for a self-supporting headquarters are listed in Cells A and B of the troop list, Appendix 5. The troops listed in Cell D will be necessary if the headquarters is established in either an undeveloped region or in a region that has received extensive war damage.

f. The administrative units considered essential for the effective administrative control of troop units are listed in Cell C of Appendix 5. An infantry regiment has also been included in Cell C to be utilized as a security force in the base section installations. However, no provision has been made for anti-aircraft defense units, as these forces will normally be made available to the base section as required.

3. Staff functions. The headquarters proper is composed of the five executive (command group and the five normal general staff sections), thirteen administrative, and seven technical staff sections which, in general, function in accordance with the normal standards prescribed in Field Manual 101-5. Specific modifications in the normal functions are as follows:

a. The Control Officer is responsible to the base section commander for maintaining and preparing such statistical records and graphical and special studies necessary to provide the commander with pertinent information at all times - specifically, concise information relative to the status of present and future planned operations, and data or information upon which to base the establishment of new, or the modification of old, policies and procedures.

b. The Chief of Staff is also the deputy commander.

c. The liaison Section is responsible for the supervision of relations between headquarters and indigenous personnel at national and provincial level, and also between headquarters and allied units.

d. The Deputy Chief of Staff, Operations, supervises all headquarters planning.

e. The Deputy Chief of Staff, Administration, is responsible for all administrative matters.

f. The Assistant Chief of Staff, G-3, is also responsible for the formulation of policies pertaining to the utilization of non-US labor.

g. The Claims Section is responsible for such supervision as is necessary to insure the expeditious settlement of meritorious claims against the United States Government.

h. The Judge Advocate General performs the normal duties, except that responsibility for claims has been delegated to the Claims Section.

i. All other sections perform functions as prescribed in Field Manual 101 - 5.

4. Conclusions and Recommendations.

a. Conclusion. A definite table of organization for a base section is desirable in that it will materially expedite the development of a given area for the support of the field forces.

b. Recommendation. It is recommended that the organization and troop list as contained in appendices 3 - 33, and the functional operation as outlined in paragraph 3, be adopted.

1. Mission. Prepare report and recommendations for a table of organization and equipment for a base section of a theater of operations.

2. Scope. Report and recommendations will be based upon experience gained in the European Theater of Operations and the table of organization and equipment will provide:

a. A headquarters organization for the exercise of purely staff functions.

b. An organization, basic and essential to any base section in any theater.

c. Expansion by the addition of personnel to handle functions peculiar to local conditions, such as G-5 or liaison sections. Similarly, reduction of personnel should be provided for in cases where functions requiring such personnel are found to be non-existent.

d. Flexibility for operation in a compact geographical area and for augmentation if the area expands so as to necessitate the establishment of town or area commands.

e. Basic troops necessary to its own existence and housekeeping, such as headquarters company, service company, postal unit, and communications.

f. A list of units of the administrative type, such as groups and depots, which must be included in any troop list to provide overhead operating personnel for a base section.

3. Instructions. a. See Plan of Operation, The General Board.

b. This report will be submitted by the Theater General Board to Headquarters, United States Forces, European Theater, in compliance with letter, Headquarters, United States Forces, European Theater, AG 320.3 GCT-AGO, (Main APO 757), 11 October 1945, "Table of Organization for a Base Section".

1. The War Department is desirous of publishing a standard table of organization and equipment for a Base Section of a theater of operations. Such a table should provide:

- a. A headquarters organization for the exercise of purely staff functions.
- b. An organization, basic and essential to any base section in any theater.
- c. Expansion by the addition of personnel to handle functions peculiar to local conditions such as G-5 or liaison sections (similarly reduction of personnel should be made where basic functions may be found to be non-existent).
- d. Flexibility for operation in a compact geographical area, for augmentation if the area expands so as to necessitate the establishment of town or area commands.
- e. Basic attached troops necessary to its own existence and house-keeping such as headquarters company, service company, postal unit, communications, etc.
- f. A list of units of the administrative type, such as groups, depots, etc., which must be included in any troop list to provide the overhead operating personnel (such personnel is essential but cannot be provided by a purely staff headquarters).

2. In accordance with letter, this office, AG 320.3 (1 Sep 45) OB-L-WDGCT-M, 7 September 1945, subject: "Processing of and Reorganization Under New Tables of Organization and Equipment", it is requested that a table of organization for the headquarters of a base section, based upon experience gained in your theater, be prepared and submitted to the War Department, to be considered in connection with planning future Army requirements.




ASSISTANT CHIEF OF STAFF, G-3
