To subscribe, first select your newsreader. Then, copy any one of the above URLs and paste it into your reader—according to the reader's directions.

Steps to using RSS feeds?

1. Choose a feed reader.

The first step is to choose an RSS reader. Each reader has a slightly different way of adding a new feed, also called a “channel.” Follow the directions for your reader but, in most cases, here's how it works:

2. Find a feed.

Click on the link or small XML button  near the feed you want. For example, CARL: News and Info. You'll see a page displaying XML code.

3. Add the feed to the feed reader.

From your web browser's address bar, copy the URL (web address). For example, the URL you would copy for CARL: News and Info is:

http://cgsc.leavenworth.army.mil/CARL/rss/generate_rss.asp

Paste that URL into the “Add New Channel” section of the reader. The RSS feed will start to display and regularly update the headlines for you.

An **RSS feed** is a simple tool for sharing and distributing Web content, such as news or any type of informational update. If a website such as one belonging to a news organization, library, or electronic journal offers an RSS feed you can automatically receive updates as they are posted. A program known as a feed reader checks a list of your selected feeds and displays any updated feed entries that it finds.

You simply decide what you want to keep current on and the feed reader collects it all for you at one place without your having to visit innumerable websites. In other words instead of visiting particular websites to browse for articles or information the RSS reader automatically displays any new or updated info it finds from those sites you've chosen. Other pluses:

- ❏ No need to give out personal info about yourself at multiple websites.
- ❏ No giving out email addresses so no risk of spam.
- ❏ You can quickly scan captions to decide what you want to read.

RSS Readers

To start using RSS, you need a special news reader or aggregator that displays RSS content feeds from Web sites you select. There are many different news readers available and most of them are free of charge. Most common are the free web-based feed readers. These afford you access to your feeds anywhere you have an Internet connection.
