



The International Hall of Fame

The International Hall of Fame (IHOF) was established in 1973 jointly between United States Army Command and General Staff College (CGSC), The Greater Kansas City Chapter of the Military Order of the World Wars (MOWW), and the CGSC Alumni Association (now CGSC Foundation). Induction consideration is extended to resident International Military Student graduates of CGSC who, through military merit, attain one of the highest positions of military importance in their country's armed forces. Fifteen IHOF inductees have also gone on to become the chief executive of their country. Honorees are inducted according to precedence established by the year of their graduation.

Inductees are presented a CGSC certificate of honor by the MOWW with a Life Constituent Certificate and eagle statuette from the CGSC Foundation. A framed portrait of each inductee is displayed, alongside previous inductees, in the International Hall of Fame Gallery located on the 3rd floor of the Lewis and Clark Center, Command and General Staff College in Fort Leavenworth, Kansas.



General Chhatra Man Singh Gurung

Chief of Army Staff, Nepal


General Chhatra Man Singh Gurung was born on 18th July 1952 in Tanahu district to the late Iman Singh Gurung and late Ima Devi Gurung. He joined the Nepalese Army and passed out from the Indian Military Academy, Dehradun in December 1973. He holds a Bachelors degree from Tribhuvan University, Nepal. He is decorated with Trishakti Patta Class III and Gorakha Dakshin Bahu Class III.



During his military career, he has undertaken several military professional courses at home and abroad. He specializes in Mountain Warfare and Para Basic Course from Nepal and Infantry YO's, Counter Insurgency and Jungle Warfare (CIJW), Battalion Support Weapon (BSW), Junior Command and Senior Command Courses from India. He is a graduate of Command and General Staff College, Fort Leavenworth, USA, and also is an alumnus of the National Defense University, China. Additionally, he has participated in various security related seminars/conferences such as PAMPs (Seoul), SEAS (USA and other countries), PASOLS (New Zealand), CHOD (USA) etc.

General Gurung has held various Command and Staff responsibilities during his career. He successfully commanded the Gorakh Box Independent Company, Shamsher Dal Infantry Battalion, an Infantry Brigade, Special Forces Brigade, and an Infantry Division during the counter insurgency operations in the volatile Mid-Western region of Nepal. He was an instructor at the Infantry School, High Altitude and Mountain Warfare School, and the Commandant of Recruit Training Center. His important staff appointments include Director of Research and Development, Director of Military Training, Quarter Master General, Chief Of Staff, and Chief of General Staff of the Nepalese Army.

General Gurung has experience in the international arena having served in the United Nations and the diplomatic corps. He served as the Operations Staff Officer, Chief Military Personnel Officer, and Chief of Staff in UNIFIL HQ, Lebanon. He was accredited as the Military Attaché of Nepal to the United Kingdom and France.

Lieutenant General Caslen currently serves as the commander of the Combined Arms Center at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, the command that oversees the Command and General Staff College and 17 other schools, centers, and training programs located throughout the United States. The Combined Arms Center is also responsible for: development of the Army's doctrinal manuals, training of the Army's commissioned and noncommissioned officers, oversight of major collective training exercises, integration of battle command systems and concepts, and supervision of the Army's Center for the collection and dissemination of lessons learned.

His prior deployments and assignments include serving as the Commanding General of the 25th Infantry Division (Light) and Commanding General of the Multi-National Division - North during OPERATION IRAQI FREEDOM; Commandant of Cadets for the United States Military Academy at West Point; Deputy Director for the War on Terrorism, J-5, The Joint Staff; Assistant Division Commander (Maneuver), 3rd Infantry Division (Mechanized); Chief of Staff, 10th Mountain Division (Light); Chief of Staff, Combined Joint Task Force Mountain during OPERATION ENDURING FREEDOM; Commander, 2nd Brigade, 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault); Chief of Staff, 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault); Senior Brigade C2 Observer/Controller, Operations Group, Joint Readiness Training Center; Commander, 1st Battalion, 14th Infantry, 25th Infantry Division (Light); Executive Officer to the Deputy Commander in Haiti during OPERATION UPHOLD DEMOCRACY; J-3 in Honduras for Joint Task Force Bravo; Brigade Operations Officer, 3rd Brigade, 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault); Executive Officer, 2nd Battalion, 187th Infantry, 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault) during OPERATIONS DESERT SHIELD/DESERT STORM.

Lieutenant General Caslen's awards and decorations include the Distinguished Service Medal, the Defense Superior Service Medal (with Oak Leaf Cluster), the Legion of Merit (with three Oak Leaf Clusters), the Bronze Star Medal (with two Oak Leaf Clusters), the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, and the Meritorious Service Medal (with five Oak Leaf Clusters). He has earned the Combat Infantryman Badge, the Joint Chiefs of Staff Identification Badge, and is Airborne, Air Assault, and Ranger qualified.

Lieutenant General Caslen graduated from the United States Military Academy at West Point in 1975. He earned Masters Degrees from Long Island University and Kansas State University.

Lieutenant General Caslen is married with three children.

Command Sergeant Major Philip F. Johndrow was born in Hempstead, New York and soon after graduating from Augusta High school in Montana enlisted in the Army in February, 1979. He attended Basic and Advanced Individual Training as an Armor Crewman at Fort Knox, Kentucky.

Prior to coming to the Combined Arms Center, CSM Johndrow served as the 1st Cavalry Division Command Sergeant Major and was deployed to Iraq as the CSM for Multi-National Division Baghdad, during the peak of the surge. He also served in Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF) I&II with the 2nd Cavalry Regiment and 1st Armored Division, and in OIF III with the 1st Armored and 3rd Infantry Division. CSM Johndrow has served in every enlisted leadership position in the Armor Branch in his over 30 years of service, including Tank Commander, Platoon Sergeant, Operations Sergeant Major, First Sergeant, and Command Sergeant Major at the Squadron, Brigade, Division and Corps Level.

Previous duty assignments include 3rd Battalion, 8th Cavalry Regiment, 1st Cavalry Division at Fort Hood, Texas; United States Armor Center at Fort Knox, Kentucky; 2nd Battalion, 72nd Tank Regiment, 2nd Infantry Division at Camp Casey, Republic of Korea; 3rd Squadron, 2nd Armored Cavalry Regiment at Fort Polk, Louisiana; 3rd Brigade, 1st Armored Division at Fort Riley, Kansas; and 1st Cavalry Division at Fort Hood, Texas.

He has earned many awards and distinctions throughout his career. These include the Legion of Merit the Bronze Star with "V" device and two oak leaf clusters, Meritorious Service Medal with three oak leaf clusters, Army Commendation Medal with "V" device and six oak leaf clusters, Recruiters Badge with three sapphires, Combat Action Badge, and German Marksmanship Badge. He is also the recipient of the Order of Saint George and St. Barbara and is a Ring Recruiter.

His military education includes the Recruiters Course, Station Commanders Course (Honor Graduate and Iron Person Award), Battle Staff Course, Master Fitness Course (Honor Graduate), First Sergeants Course (Exceeded Course Standards), United States Army Sergeants Major Academy Class #51 (History Award and the John O. Marsh Award), and the Command Sergeants Major Course and the Keystone Course.

CSM Johndrow earned a Masters's degree Summa Cum Laude in Business Administration. He is married and has two children and four grandchildren.
