COL Dean Bushnell began his career by enlisting in 1984 and serving at Fort Kobbe, Panama, and Hunter Army Airfield, Georgia. He deployed in support of Operations Just Cause and Desert Storm. In 1992, COL Bushnell received his commission through Officer Candidate School as an infantry second lieutenant. He earned a Bachelor of Arts in addition to a Master of Arts in Education from Central Michigan University, Master of



Military Arts and Sciences from The Air University and a Master of Strategic Studies from the Army War College. He is a graduate of the Infantry Officer Basic and Advanced Courses, Combined Arms and Services Staff School, Command and General Staff College, and Army War College.

While assigned to Schofield Barracks and the 25th Infantry Division (Light), he served as Platoon Leader, Company Executive Officer, and Scout Platoon Leader in 4th Battalion, 22nd Infantry. COL Bushnell deployed in support of Operation Uphold Democracy. Upon his assignment to Fort Stewart, Georgia, he served as the Deputy Brigade S3, 1st Brigade, 3rd Infantry Division (Mechanized). He later commanded Charlie Company and Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 2nd Battalion, 7th Infantry where he deployed in support of Operation Desert Thunder. Upon completion of command, he served as the S3 for 6th Brigade, First Region at Hunter Army Airfield, Georgia. Following Air Force Command and General Staff College, he participated in Operation Iraqi Freedom III and served as an Operations Officer for Coalition Forces Land Component Command (CFLCC) and Multi-National Forces-Iraq in Baghdad, Iraq.

Prepositioned for Battalion Command, COL Bushnell served as Deputy Commander, 199th Infantry Brigade before serving as Commandant and Battalion Commander, 3rd Battalion (OCS), 11th Infantry Regiment. COL Bushnell served as Deputy Commander, 4th Infantry Brigade Combat Team, 4th Infantry Division at Fort Carson, Colorado, including another deployment to Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom.
