Mr Jerome K. Hawkins is currently the Director of the Intermediate Course at the Army Management Staff College (AMSC). He has over 29 years of federal service as an active duty Soldier and Department of the Army Civilian. He has extensive experience in the areas of leadership and executive education. Previous leadership positions include:

Director of the Executive Strategy Group, Office of the Chief of Staff, Army where he authored strategic documents and assisted Army leadership with shaping and developing policy. In his most recent combat deployment to Afghanistan he served as Director Afghan National Security Planning Center. In this capacity he led a multi-national planning and execution contingent which orchestrated the 2009 presidential elections in Afghanistan. As an executive educator: Mr Hawkins served as the Director of the Department of Joint, Interagency, and Multinational Operations (DJIMO) educating mid-grade officers at the graduate level. He also served as a Seminar Leader at the School of Advanced Military Studies (SAMS), a graduate level experience, for a seminar of hand selected high performing students focused on history, theory, doctrine and practical application at the operational level of war. Additionally, Mr Hawkins commanded the Officer Instruction Battalion at Fort Sill which included all facets of curriculum development and the execution of instruction for the U.S. Army Field Artillery Officer Basic Course and the U.S. Army Captains Career Course.

His civilian education includes a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science from Hampton University, a Master of Military Art and Science in Theater Operations (Strategic Studies) from the Command and General Staff College. He is also a graduate of the Advanced Operational Arts Studies Fellowship (MEL 1), from the School of Advanced Military Studies, the Command and General Staff Officer Course, from the Command and General Staff College, and the Joint Planning and Operations Course (Joint Professional Military Education 2), National Defense University, Norfolk, VA, and the U.S. Army Ranger School, Fort Benning, Georgia.
