MEMORANDUM FOR All Warrant Officer Candidates

SUBJECT: Warrant Officer Candidate School (WOCS) Welcome and Orientation

1. Congratulations on your selection to attend WOCS. The WOCS is a physically, mentally, and emotionally challenging school designed to prepare you to begin your warrant officer career. The daily training, mentoring, and feedback regimen, in a task saturated environment, will help you refine the leadership skills and attributes required of an Army warrant officer.
