LTC Mike Johnson is a native of Chester, Virginia and commissioned as an Ordnance Officer upon graduation from Christopher Newport University, Newport News, Virginia in 2007. He is married to Mandy Johnson of Hampton, VA, and they have two children, Caleb, age 13, and Caleigh, age 12.
