On the 15th day of this month, we have the honor and privilege of observing National Prisoner of War/
Missing In Action Recognition Day. National POW/MIA Recognition Day was established in 1979 through a
proclamation signed by President Jimmy Carter, and proclamations have been issued annually since then by
each subsequent president. Observances of National POW/MIA Recognition Day are held across the country on
military installations, ships at sea, state capitols, schools, and veterans' facilities. These National POW/MIA
Recognition Day ceremonies, no matter where they are held, share the common purpose of honoring those who
were held captive and returned, as well as those who remain missing.

Beyond our national commitment to honor, remember, and recognize prisoners of war and the missing in action, the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency (DPAA) actively works across 46 countries in support of the noble mission to account for the nearly 82,000 Americans still missing. DPAA's mission is to provide the fullest possible accounting for missing personnel from designated past conflicts to their families and the nation. They strive to give families what solace and answers they can by providing information about their loved ones' service and, ultimately, their sacrifice. The DPAA is determined to do whatever it can to bring these unaccounted-for DoD personnel home.

As part of our observance (15 September, 1130 at the Frontier Conference Center), MAJ Jared Dickey, the Deputy Director for Expeditionary Support at DPAA, will give a presentation that highlights specific ongoing efforts by DPAA in support of their mission. SEEK THEN SPEAK

SEEK THEN SPEAK offers sexual assault survivors and support people a way to privately gather information and explore options for medical care, supportive services, and reporting to police (**SEEK**). If they choose, survivors can then begin the process of reporting to police by completing a detailed, self-guided interview (**SPEAK**).

SEEK: EXPLORE OPTIONS

SEEK provides critical information on:

- •Sexual Assault
- •Crime Victim Rights
- Victim Advocacy
- •Medical Care / Forensic Exams
- Reporting to Police



SPEAK: BEGIN REPORTING

SPEAK guides survivors through questions designed to gather critical information about their sexual assault. The program then generates a PDF report the survivor can give to law enforcement, as a first step toward investigating their sexual assault.
