Brigadier General Charles W. Morrison was commissioned as an Adjutant General Officer upon graduation from Officer Candidate School in 1997, and later conducted a branch transfer to Infantry Officer.

Brigadier General Morrison holds master's degrees from American Military University, Charles Town, West Virginia, and the United States Army War College, Carlisle Barracks, Pennsylvania.

Brigadier General Morrison has served in multiple leadership roles from platoon leader to brigade commander. He has served in combat in Iraq as both an infantry company commander and later as a battalion executive officer. His career assignments have spanned the globe from Washington, D.C. to Iraq.

His most recent assignment was as the Deputy Director of Operations, Readiness, and Mobilization, HQDA G-3/5/7, Washington, D.C. Prior to that he served as the Commander, 30th Armored Brigade Combat Team, Clinton, North Carolina. Brigadier General Morrison also served as the G3, North Carolina Army National Guard, followed by Chief of Staff, North Carolina Army National Guard, and then Director of Joint Staff, North Carolina Army National Guard.
