Brigadier General Jerry “Fred” Prochaska became the Deputy Commanding General (DCG), United States Army Combined Arms Center – Army National Guard on 22 April 2019. In his role as DCG, he is the Combined Arms Center Commanding General’s principal advisor on all matters pertaining to the training and education of the Army National Guard component.

BG Prochaska’s assignment history includes Armor Platoon Leader, A/7-112 Armor BN, Huntsville, TX in 1989, Armor Platoon Leader B/7-112 Armor BN, Crockett, TX in 1990, Armor Platoon Leader A/4-112 Armor BN in El Campo, TX in 1992, and Executive Officer, A/4-112 Armor BN, El Campo, TX in 1994. In October 1994, 4-112 Armor BN assigned him as the Scout Platoon Leader in Marshall, TX and he remained there until September 1996 when he assumed the duties of S-3 Air, 4-112 Armor BN, Bryan, TX. Subsequently, he served as Commander, A/4-112 Armor BN, El Campo, TX through October 1999. Following Command, BG Prochaska served as Plans Officer, 36th Infantry Division. BG Prochaska volunteered for active duty in December 2004 and served as Deputy G7, Information Operations, Multi National Task Force East, Kosovo from June 2005 through January 2007. BG Prochaska remained on active duty, attended the Red Team Leaders Course in Fort Leavenworth, KS, and served three years with the Joint Improvised Explosive Device Defeat Organization to include a tour in Afghanistan. Subsequently, BG Prochaska served as the G7, Information Operations, for United States Division – South, in Basrah, Iraq. In December 2011, he assumed command of the 101st Information Operations BN. Following Command, he served as the G3, Operations, 71st Troop Command. BG Prochaska assumed command of the 71st Theater Information Operations Group in September 2016 before transitioning to his current position.
