MAJ John Ronayne is a native of Plano, TX. He graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Liberal Studies from Texas A&M Central Texas, Master of International Affairs in National Security and Diplomacy from Texas A&M University, and Master of Science in Operational Studies from CGSOC.

MAJ Ronayne enlisted into the Army in August of 1996 and served in a myriad of duty positions to include Squad Leader, Platoon Sergeant, and First Sergeant. In 2009, he was awarded an Army Active Duty Green to Gold Scholarship and received his commission through the Reserve Officer Training Course and was the Distinguished Meritorious Graduate for his ROTC class.

MAJ Ronayne is a graduate of Primary Leadership Development Course, Basic Non-Commissioned Officers Course, Signal Basic Officer's Leader Course (Honor Graduate), Signal Captain's Career Course (Kilbourne Leadership Award), Command and General Staff College, Knowledge Management Course, Joint Planners Course, and Operational Contract Support.

After commissioning, MAJ Ronayne was assigned to serve as the Platoon Leader as a member of Headquarters and Headquarters Battery, 1st Battalion, 82nd Field Artillery Regiment, 1st Armored Brigade Combat Team, 1st Cavalry Division forward deployed to Tallil, Iraq and Camp Buehring, Kuwait. He then served as Battery Executive Officer for Headquarters and Headquarter Battery, before being assigned as the Battalion S-6. After completing his assignment as Battalion S-6, MAJ Ronayne was selected to assume command of the Division Signal Company, which was reflagged to the Signal, Intelligence, and Sustainment Company, Headquarters and Headquarters Battalion, 1st Cavalry Division. MAJ Ronayne was then selected by the Signal Branch for the Performance Based-Graduate School Incentive Program (PB-GSIP) and completed his master's degree. He then served as a Capability Developer for the Mission Command (MC) Capabilities Development Integration Directorate with responsibility for a variety of analytical work regarding Army Mission Command projects, such a Command Post Computing Environment (CPCE). He was previously assigned as the CAC G33, Chief of CUOPs in the CAC G-3/5/7 to assist in ensuring successful execution of all operational requirements through preparation and distribution of operations orders, taskings (operational and individual/WIAS), reporting, and directives.

MAJ Ronayne has deployed five times to the CENTCOM AOR for OIF 2003-2004 with 57th SIG BN ISO 425th CA, OIF 06-08 with 57th SIG BN, OIF 09-10 with 1CD HQ, OIF 11 and Kuwait 12 with 1-82 FA BN, 1ABCT, 1CD. He also participated in 1ABCT's NRF/ERF mission in 2014.
